CALENDAR DESCRIPTION

This course provides an overview of some of the most significant methodological approaches and critical practices used by art historians to write about art and visual culture. With these we will be exploring new interpretive models and multidisciplinary approaches such as structuralism, semiotics, post-structuralism, and psychoanalytic theory, as well as political theories such as feminism and socio-cultural theory.
