Brief Course Synopsis:

This course introduces students to core skills and techniques in theatre: voice, body, and interpretation. Through a combination of analysis, practice, and response, students will gain comfort with tools that support the use of voice, movement and text in various styles of performance. There is equal focus on the development of constructive feedback, coaching, and response - core skills in directing and casting.

Students will increase their capacity to bring scenes and characters to life through learning a range of techniques that train and care for the performers primary expressive instruments – voice and body. Engaging in script analysis and scene development along with peers will enhance understanding of the many ways to create and enliven theatrical material. There will be opportunities to explore ensemble and solo practices that will provide a strong basis for future work in the live and performing arts.
