This is a two-stage application process:

- 1. Letters of Intent (LOI): Researchers are to submit their LOI directly to the sponsor. The deadline for submission of the 2018 CARP LOI is Tuesday, October 31, 2017. All submissions should be sent to the attention of Gail Hoskins, CCC Crop Production Administrator and CARP Coordinator at: hoskinsg@canolacouncil.org. Researchers are not required to submit their LOI to the Office of Research for approval before submission to the sponsor, however Researchers are asked to send a copy of their LOI to the Office of Research for information purposes only (no OR-5 required at the LOI stage). Notifications and requests for Full Proposals will be sent to Researchers by the sponsor by Thursday, November 30, 2017.
- Full Proposal: Researchers invited to submit a full proposal must submit their full proposal to the Office of Research two weeks in advance of the sponsor's deadline with a signed OR-5.
