Researchers can expect to be notified regarding the outcome of the LOI within three weeks of submission. Those researchers who are invited to full proposal should notify Kristin Gibson in the Office of Research Services. An OR5 form and a copy of the full-proposal will be due to the Office of Research Services one week prior to the deadline established by the Canola Council of Canada.

This is a two-stage application process:

- 1. Letters of Intent (LOI): Researchers are to submit their LOI directly to the sponsor. Please utilize this template [6] for submission of your LOI noting that collaboration with multiple organizations is welcome and encouraged. All submissions should be sent to the attention of Gail Hoskins, CCC Crop Production Administrator and CARP Coordinator at: <a href="https://hoskinsg@canolacouncil.org">hoskinsg@canolacouncil.org</a> [5]. Researchers are not required to submit their LOI to the Office of Research for approval before submission to the sponsor, however Researchers are asked to send a copy of their LOI to the Office of Research for information purposes only (no OR-5 required at the LOI stage).
- 2. Full Proposal: Researchers invited to submit a full proposal must submit their full proposal to the Office of Research two weeks in advance of the sponsor's deadline, along with a signed OR-5.
