As the national leader in veterans' chronic pain research, the Chronic Pain Centre of Excellence for Canadian Veterans (CPCoE) funds research that improves the well-being of veterans, and their families, living with chronic pain. To allocate funding, the CPCoE uses a competitive application process culminating in review by the Scientific Advisory Board.

### **Funding Availability**

Funding availability of all opportunities is \$1.3 million dollars and is anticipated to be awarded across 9 grants (3 per program).
