Description

Eligibility

- Full-time grad students at all Canadian universities
- Canadian citizens, permanent residents, and international students over the age of 18
- All academic disciplines
- Businesses and not-for-profit organizations operating in Canada

- Students must spend 50% of the internship with the academic institution and 50% with the partner organization
- Faculty at all Canadian Universities who are eligible to hold Tri-Council funds

Maximum Project Value

Interns are provided with a stipend/salary starting at \$10,000 per four-month period. Typically, internships are approved for a total of \$15,000, including a minimum \$10,000 stipend and maximum \$5,000 in research costs with \$7,500 coming from the industry partner matched with \$7,500 from Mitacs.

Internships start at four months. Master's students can do up to four four-month internships and PhD students can do up to eight.

Graduate students seeking longer-term funding can also apply to <u>Mitacs Accelerate Fellowship</u> [3] funding.
