Description

Grants awarded through this RFA are intended to provide early support for exploratory ideas, particularly those with novel hypotheses for autism.

The goal of the Pilot Award is to provide early support for exploratory ideas, particularly those with novel hypotheses. Appropriate projects for this mechanism include those considered higher risk with less assurance of ultimate impact, but with the potential for transformative results. Investigators new to the field of autism are encouraged to apply for Pilot Awards. Eligibility

All applicants and key collaborators must hold a Ph.D., M.D. or equivalent degree and have a faculty position or the equivalent at a college, university, medical school or other research facility. In addition, eligible applicants must have independent lab space at their institution. There are no citizenship or country requirements.

Multiple Applications and Resubmissions

As mentioned in the sponsor's <u>accompanying blog post</u> [1], for the 2018–2019 acdemic year, the plan is to release two Pilot Award request for applications (RFAs), i.e., the current RFA and one in Summer 2019, in addition to one Research RFA (in early 2019). Principal Investigators may only submit one Pilot Award and one Research Award application per academic year. In addition, unfunded Pilot Award proposals may not be re-submitted in consecutive Pilot Award cycles (e.g. if an application is submitted to the Winter 2019 Pilot Award RFA, the next eligibility for re-submission would be for the Winter 2020 Pilot Award RFA or if an application is submitted for the Summer 2019 Pilot Award RFA, the next eligibility would be for the Summer 2020 Pilot Award RFA). For investigators with active SFARI grants, renewal requests will be considered but we also encourage investigators to seek continuation support from outside—usually federal—funding sources.
